I extend my congratulations to the Calgary Catholic Education Foundation (CCEF) which celebrates its 10th anniversary as a charitable organization. It was initially established by the Catholic community to promote fund raising for our Calgary Catholic schools, the students and their families, which aligned with the Church's social justice teaching.

In working alongside the Calgary Catholic School
District and the Diocese of Calgary the
Board of Directors of CCEF have over the last 10
years provided \$3 Million dollars in donations to 116
schools and 58,000 students. The Diocese through
the Catholic Education Sunday
Collection that occurs on the first Sunday in
November each year has contributed \$882,000 of
this overall fundraising effort.

The funds raised have been disbursed for extracurricular student programs such as Leading Edge Learning Opportunities, Safe, Caring and Faith-Filled Schools, and the promotion of student awards for Social Justice and Citizenship, Stewardship and Leadership Development.

In the years ahead the CCEF will continue to play a critical role in supporting Calgary Catholic schools and the programs which impact the lives and faith of the students. May the Holy Spirit guide these initiatives and the efforts of the Foundation.

But the best laid plans can be




































34TH Annual Golf Tournament

St. Angela Workplace School

St. Angela workplace school is a small elementary school located in the heart of Calgary within the community of Bridgeland. St. Angela supports parents who work in or close to Calgary's downtown core and want their children to be in a school located close to their workplace.

St. Angela provides before and after school care along with a breakfast and lunch program with other local charities. But this wasn't meeting the food security needs of students during weekends, school holidays or even professional development day.

The CCEF funded a school pantry for \$6,000 which equipped the school to benefit students outside of school days. They expanded it to include school supplies and clothing swaps. The students helped to compose letters to local merchants to help fund the pantry with donated food items.

Leading edge learning opportunities

In today's competitive world, which is all things digital, it goes without saying that students should be developing the skill set that is fundamental to their future success; working with technology and all its platforms. And yet, right here in Calgary, there are students who do not have access to portable devices to continue their learning from home during Covid-19.

In 2019, the CCEF awarded over \$33,000 for technology. The reality though is that we declined over \$76,000 in technology requests from schools.

Helping Our Lady of Assumption buy Grow Towers

Our Lady of the Assumption received \$6,000 from the CCEF purchase Grow Towers. Their project was called Steward of the Environment Growing Food that is healthy and sustainable. Students were engaged from idea conception to implementation. Students learned about sustainability, environmental responsibility and growing food. They tasted foods they did not think they liked, only to discover that home-grown, organic foods taste different (better) than store bought foods and they shared this insight with parents, teachers and students alike.

This project had a meaningful impact on one student in particular:

"The biggest impact was watching one of my ES1 JH students who normally struggles to engage with his work, take a complete interest in the tower. From the moment the grow tower came into my classroom, he was invested in everything was occurring. To see him engage in such a way was a delight and has made me start thinking how we could use this grow tower in a way that further enriches our Special Ed Learning environment ." - Ms. McKellar, Junior High ES1 Teacher

Our Lady of Lourdes experiences Quest Theatre

Our Lady of Lourdes School has one of the smallest enrollments in the CCSD with only 34 students from grades 1 to 9. However these students are 100% diverse learning students with mild to moderate cognitive disabilities. The school received a \$4000 grant to bring Quest Theatre in for a residency with the students. This is an opportunity for students to express themselves through drama as well participate in fine arts through interactive, engaging methods of theater production building on collaboration skills, critical thinking, conflict resolution and incorporate physical movement. Students and parents enjoyed the end production which the CCEF was happy to attend.





